

**The Carriage of Dangerous Goods and Use of Transportable Pressure
Equipment Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2010 (as amended)
Authorisation No 1013**

Applicable to Carriage by Road Only

This authorisation is given in accordance with regulation 9 of The Carriage of Dangerous Goods and Use of Transportable Pressure Equipment Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2010 (as amended) (CDG 2010).

PURPOSE

To allow Dangerous Goods Driver Training (DGDТ), including both theory and individual practical elements required under ADR Chapter 8.2, to be delivered remotely to candidates who are applying for or refreshing an ADR Driver Training Certificate in line with the provisions set out in ADR Chapter 8.2.

TIME LIMIT

This authorisation will come into effect from 1st January 2023 and shall remain in force until 31st December 2024 unless withdrawn or otherwise revoked.

ALTERNATIVE CARRIAGE PROVISIONS

1. HSENI and SQA are authorised to deviate from sections 4.5.3, 4.5.4, 6.6.1 and 6.7 of the “ADR Carriage of Dangerous Goods and use of Transportable Pressure Equipment Manual of Practice November 2020” to allow delivery of all elements of Dangerous Goods Driver Training, not including the examinations, to be delivered remotely.
2. The practical element of the Dangerous Goods Driver Training, as required in ADR 8.2.2.3.8, must be demonstrated by the trainer, with the candidates then individually asked to complete written questions and answers on the practical elements to demonstrate knowledge levels.
3. The practical elements of the training must be demonstrated by the trainer prior to the examination being completed as required by ADR 8.2.2.7.1.1 except that the practical elements may be undertaken remotely.

4. Training providers will require competent authority approval for the delivery of remote training as required by ADR 8.2.2.6. Applications for approval must be submitted to the SQA.
5. Candidates will continue to have their knowledge tested on the practical elements in the written examination as required by ADR 8.2.2.1.
6. Candidates will continue to attend approved training centres to complete examinations, as examinations cannot be completed remotely and must be invigilated.

All other provisions of CDG 2010 shall be complied with at all times.
